Small conical holes in the where they have been digging predators. - Ffion This digging action creates space for new native plants to colonise while also aerating the soil, but possibly the most important relationship that quendas have is with fungi. As they feed on the underground body of the fungus they spread the spores around the garden through their faeces. Studies have shown that one quenda poop can carry over one Get Ready for Native Bees beneficial- fungi!
